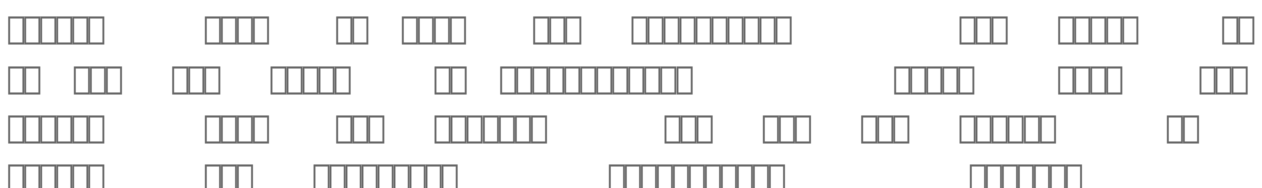


Diagram illustrating the layout of a packet header, showing various fields and their relative positions:
